<u>School Closure for Christmas</u>

Please note that it is necessary for us to close a day earlier than planned for Christmas so that a deep clean can be carried out in readiness for children returning in January.

School will therefore now finish on Wednesday 16th December, 2020 and re-open on Tuesday 5th January.

Christmas Cards

We recognise that children like to send Christmas cards to their friends so we have decided that this can happen albeit with some rules attached.

On Monday 30th November and Tuesday 8th December post boxes will be on the school grounds in which your child's Christmas cards can be posted. Each set of cards will then be quarantined for 1 week before being distributed to their friends.

There will be no facility to accept cards other than on these two dates and all cards must be posted in the boxes provided. Children will not be able to bring any cards into the school building. Class Teachers will distribute name lists for their classes/bubbles - please ensure that cards are labelled with forename and surname so that they reach the correct recipient.

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COVID19 Testing

In order to keep our school and the extended community safe, please can we remind you that if your child or a member of your household becomes unwell and develops the published or other symptoms of COVID19:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change in your sense of taste or smell this means you've noticed that you cannot taste or smell anything, or things taste or smell differently than normal
- Please contact 111 / 119 and inform the school as soon as possible.
- Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible
- Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test results only leave your home to have a test. Please remember that until you receive the results of the test - your child and family members / support bubble must self-isolate.
- If your child has a cold but feels ok and doesn't have a temperature or a cough or any other symptoms that may be COVID related they may come to school.
- If your child feels unwell, for whatever reason, they should stay at home but please keep us informed.

Negative COVID Test

Positive COVID Test

- Please advise us immediately on 01902 372558
- Please forward email you receive or send a screen shot of a text message to <u>admin@albrighton-</u> <u>pri.shropshire..sch.uk</u>
- The person with the confirmed COVID19 result must self-isolate at their home for 10 days from the first date that their symptoms started. If this is your child, they can return to school on day 11 provide that on days 9 & 10 they have no fever symptoms and are feeling better.
- The rest of the household and bubble need to self-isolate for 14 days from the onset date of the person's symptoms.
- Anyone who was in contact with the person whilst they were infectious will need to self-isolate at home for 14 days from the last date of contact with the person who tested positive

It will be helpful to refer to the attached flowchart or our risk assessment which advises you on actions to take if you are concerned that your child may have coronavirus. The risk assessment is on our website.
