#### Headteacher's Note:

Hi everyone,

We're really excited that we are able to offer swimming lessons again from next week. With fully trained swimming instructors and lifeguards, we are very fortunate to be able to offer this provision at our school. Our pupils benefit from lessons from Years 2 to 6 and really do enjoy their swimming.

Most of you will know that the children can also enjoy the pool at weekends and during the Summer holidays. This is due to volunteers running Albrighton Swimming Club. They also plan to open this year and we will inform you of the date as soon as it is decided upon.

The swimming pool costs a significant amount of money to heat and maintain each year. Alongside the school and swimming club contributing funding are the endeavours of Friends of Albrighton Swimming Pool (FASP), also a voluntary organisation who run the Albrighton lottery and without whose financial support the swimming pool could not remain open.

Numbers supporting the lottery however have been dwindling and we need a bit of a resurgence to enable the longer term opening of the pool. I will write to you next week with more information about this.

We are asking our young designers to think about who their hero or heroes are, and to then design a stamp in their honour.


A special panel of judges will pick the winning designs. The final eight stamps will be sent to Her Majesty The Queen before they can be printed and issued.

#### Growth Mindset


At Albrighton Primary School, we know that pupils who have a positive attitude towards their learning will make good progress and be successful. Consequently, instilling all our pupils with 'growth mindsets' has become a key priority for the school this term and beyond especially following the recent lockdowns.

We have introduced the theories of Dr Carol Dweck to staff and pupils and are determined to embed its ideas within our school ethos.

We want all our pupils to relish challenges, embrace their mistakes as part of the learning process, value the importance of effort, respond carefully to feedback and take inspiration from others. This will help them to achieve, not only with us, but also in their future lives as adults. We are very excited about the prospect of nurturing a growth mindset culture at our school over the coming months and seeing our pupils 'bounce back' from all of the disruption they have endured over the last year.

#### Encouraging children to become confident and resilient learners

We know that in order to fulfil the potential of our pupils and encourage them to become confident and resilient learners we, as a team of parents and staff, need to be modelling the mindset of a learner who is not afraid of making mistakes but who thrives upon them, knowing that this is all part of the learning process. The way in which we encourage children to learn and explore is vital to their success, not only at school but at home as well. Central to this attitude and approach to learning, are the theories and proven evidence of Growth Mindset. This is a term coined by psychologist Carol Dweck and her research has identified the characteristics of learners with a fixed and a growth mindset:






# Reception Rangers have had to turn into police officers this week!

We came into school on Tuesday to find our interactive television and discovery dinosaur gone!


We found some clues – they all linked to Hefty Hugh and Lanky Len from 'What the Ladybird Heard'!

#### Swimming Sessions

Swimming lessons begin in school the week commencing Monday 10th May 2021 for year groups 2-6; the timetable is shown below.

Please ensure that your child has the necessary swimwear. Girls must have a one-piece swimming costume and boys should have swimming trunks (boys can wear swim shorts but they must be above the knee). Swimwear can be any colour.

Swimming goggles are allowed but not snorkel masks. Please ensure that goggles fit properly prior to the lesson. Pupils with long hair must have it tied back or wear a swimming cap. Any child with a verruca or athlete's foot should wear a special latex swim sock. All jewellery including earrings must be removed.

Can pupils please bring in a towel and a plastic bag to put their wet things into afterwards. A warm waterproof coat is also essential.

Swimming is part of our physical education programme as recommended in the National Curriculum guidelines and is therefore not an optional activity. All children from Year 2 up are expected to take part in swimming lessons unless there are medical reasons why they cannot. In which case, please put this in writing to your child's class teacher.
