We have had lots of fun exploring outside. We are going to be finding out about the different animals that visit our school grounds.




## Memorable Experiences Years 1 and 2


Then, we looked at Greek pottery and noticed that stories were often retold on there. We designed our own pottery, telling the legend of our mythical creature.

# Safer Schools





Supporting Mrs Bratt as the new Deputy Headteacher, Mrs Tearle gave a fresh start to the Safer School initiative at Albrighton Primary School and recently held a Safer School meeting. This is a security/safety initiative and the meeting was well attended by staff, governors, parents, pupils and West Mercia Police.

Primarily this meeting was planning for the future but we did include the essentials of the initiative, including reviewing any school issues, considering improvements and updating a security/safety checklist. The meeting also reflected on the improvements made since the previous meeting. An important aspect of the initiative is gathering feedback from parents/carers and pupils and this meeting was reassuring with good contributions from both the parents and pupils that attended. It is proposed to expand this involvement to all parents/carers and pupils using a survey. An excellent meeting and a new Safer School certificate was presented to the school. A future meeting is scheduled for the Spring term 2022.

# Health and Wellbeing

Talking to your child about how they're feeling can be hard. You might feel like you don't know where to start or when a 'good time' to talk is.



By taking 20 minutes to do an activity you both enjoy, you can create a relaxed space for getting the conversation started. The Young Minds website has got lots of activity ideas, conversation starters and advice for making talking easier.

If your child tells you they're struggling, it's important to make sure they feel seen and heard. If you're worried about something that's come up in conversation, be honest and clear about how you see things and how you want to support them.


When responding, it helps to:

- Validate their feelings. You could say 'it's really understandable that you're feeling...' to let them know that their feelings are okay.
- Thank them for sharing what's going on and be encouraging about the way they've opened up.
- Let them know that you love them, you're there for them, they can talk to you whenever they need to, and you can help them get support if they need it.
- Ask them if there's anything you could do that they would find particularly helpful.
- Spend time together thinking about what's making them feel this way. It could be something at home or school, a relationship with a friend or family member or something else.
- Let your child know about the helplines, textlines and online chat services that are available which you can find at the end of this guide. Young people can find it difficult to talk and worry about upsetting their parents, so reassure them that it's okay to open up to other people.
- Remind your child that this is temporary. Reassure them that things can change and they can feel better.
- Avoid conversations at the height of distress. It's important to be there for them, but it can be more helpful to talk about the causes when things are feeling calmer.

## Parent Voice

Thank you to everyone who filled in our Parents Meeting Parent Voice Questionnaire. Out of our 66 replies, 64 parents were either happy or very happy with their child's progress.

#### Examples of comments regarding progress:

- Very happy with my child's progress he always seems to enjoy his school day and always tells me what he has done.
- Very happy with how confident my child is becoming. He is really enjoying all aspects of his school day.
- We are pleased with our daughter's progress in phonics. Her confidence has also developed exceptionally.
- Extremely proud of my daughter and her love and attitude towards learning. Keep pushing her to expand on her learning.
- I can really see a progression in writing particularly. Work and activities sent home seem to be well thought
  out.
- I'm really pleased, my child is very happy and always excited to go to school. It's lovely to see her progress
  so quickly, compared to progression before school. It's amazing to see how much she picks up, with the
  time to practice and teacher guidance.
- He has become a lot more positive regarding his reading and the spellings he is given are challenging. His knowledge about London and historical events has been lovely to hear about.

We intend to send out more questionnaires in the future for 'Parent voice' and Mrs Tearle will shortly be setting up a parent panel. Although the number of Covid cases in our area remains high, I am delighted that Mrs Bratt and her team have been able to ensure that all of our children have returned safely to school at the beginning of the new school year and all of the evidence shows that children have made tremendous progress and are, once again, enjoying all aspects of school especially being with their friends and taking part in a very exciting curriculum.

On behalf of the governors, I would like to thank you for your continued support of the school and the way in which you have worked with the school to provide as little disruption as possible caused by the pandemic.

This leads me to ask, once again, whether you would be prepared to join us and become a member of the Governing Body. We have one vacancy. The work is very rewarding and extremely interesting and it means that you would have a role in deciding the future of the school. We are all looking forward to the exciting new projects that are currently being developed.

A recent monitoring exercise carried out by our school's adviser, who is also an OFSTED inspector, demonstrated that the school has outperformed the vast majority of primary schools in ensuring that children are on track to meet and even exceed the targets set them before the pandemic. It also showed how the new developments with the primary curriculum are meeting the new OFSTED framework standards. Most importantly, he saw happy children whose knowledge and skill base were of a very high standard because of their enjoyment of learning at the school.
